

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)

Pupil premium, which is additional to the main school funding, is provided for schools to support specific groups of pupils:

- pupils entitled to receive free school meals
- pupils who have been eligible to receive free school meals in the past 6 years
- looked after children
- pupils whose parents are serving in the armed forces.

The purpose of this money is to close the attainment gap between these pupils and their peers.

How did we spend the money?

ELSA support – to help children develop better self-esteem and resilience, improved social skills and to overcome emotional barriers to their learning

Additional adult support in classrooms, at playtimes and delivering specific intervention programmes

Supporting pupils with the cost of extra-curricular activities such as trips or music lessons / uniform

As we have relatively small numbers of pupils who are eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant, we identify any barriers to achievement on an individual pupil basis. Progress is tracked and analysed throughout the year. Individual needs are addressed as part of our regular assessment and review procedures.

ELSA support has proved particularly effective in improving the emotional resilience and self-belief of our disadvantaged children and so help them learn, as has targeted TA intervention. Financial support for extra-curricular activities has also helped broaden their life experiences.

Music lessons and free school uniform have proved to have less of an impact than anticipated when offered to all eligible children; in future these will only be offered to children on an individual basis where it is felt to be appropriate.

As a school, our core approach is to deliver quality first teaching, in addition to specific, targeted interventions led by TAs, to all children to support their academic progress. This will be supported by ELSA sessions to address emotional concerns.

The overall aim of our pupil premium strategy is not only to raise the attainment of all children but also to reduce the attainment gap between the school's disadvantaged pupils and their peers in both in-school and national assessments.
