To provide a variety of differing sporting activities for these children.</p> <p>To provide additional swimming lessons for those unable to swim 25m by the end of Year 4.</p>	<p>To promote the teaching and performance of Dance and Swimming within the school. Children throughout the school have received the benefit of having a series of dance lesson delivered by trained professional. Progression of the children’s dance ability is ensured as the same teacher – teachers all year groups.
