Key achievements to date including July 2024:

Swimming taught to the whole of Year 4 and the remaining members of Year 5 who missed out on swimming tuition due to a number of factors. A substantial percentage of these year groups have now reached the key standard in swimming of being able to swim (unaided) 25 metres.

Continued development of class teacher's knowledge of Dance.

A range of experiences were offered to KS1 and KS2 designed to engage the interests of our pupils in physical activity in after school clubs. Including KS2 Football, KS2 Rugby, KS2 Girls Football, KS2 Rounders, KS2 Cricket and KS1 Multi Sports.

Each year group had the opportunity to take part in or compete in a sporting activity in 2022 – 2023.

Inclusion of dance in numerous festival days – children from all key stages were able to learn and perform several different dances and dance styles from around the world.
